**High School Grades In Colored School**

M. D. Billings, superintendent of Macon county schools, has announced the granting of a teacher for high school grades for the negro school by the state school commission.

The school building on St. Cyprian's church property, adjoining the Chapel school property, has been secured and is being equipped for the high school classes. These classes will have as

teachers Homer Kemp, who is one of the teachers already employed, and who has a grade A certificate as well as high school principal's certificate; Frank K. Davis, a graduate of St. Augustine's college, Raleigh, has been offered the new position provided by the state school commission. On account of the small number prepared for high school work who can avail themselves of this opportunity there will be only one or two grades provided this year.
