Missionaries

For Sunday School Union Locate in Franklin

Mr. and Mrs. Ronald H. Hull, missionaries of the American Sunday School Union, have been recently transferred from Hendersonville to Franklin to take over the work of ministering to those in isolated and neglected communities who are otherwise unreached.

While making Franklin their headquarters, they plan to labor in seven of the North Carolina counties as well as part of northeastern Georgia. The work includes organizing Union Sunday schools, conducting daily vacation Bible schools and teacher training classes, sponsoring evangelistic services, establishing prayer meetings and young people's societies, distributing Christian literature and home visitation,

The American Sunday School Union was established in 1817, and during these years has carried on a continuous ministry in various parts of rural America. At the present time there are 186 missionaries on the field. The work is supported largely through gifts from friends of all denominations who understand the need of this home missionary work.

Fine Collection Of Minerals On Display

One of the most interesting mineral collections ever seen in this section is on display this week in the show window of Angel's Drug

The collection is the property of Ellis Clarke Soper, and includes minerals from many places, A polinhed section of an agatized log from the petrified forest in Arizona and a mastodon's tooth from Alaska are probably the finest exhibits in the collection, which also includes amethyst from Michigan, beautifully colored sand from Yellowstone park, carbonated copper from Arizona, azurite from an Arizona copper mine, quartz crystals with sulphur from Louisiana, pyrite, iron ore, tourmaline, carborundum, fluorite, asbestos, fossils, malachite and other specimens,

Tuberculosis Clinic To Be Held In September

The North Carolina state board of health has arranged for a county-wide tuberculosis survey to be conducted on September 9, 10 and until 12:30 noon on the 12th.

Dr. Denholm, clinician from the North Carolina state sanatorium, will hold the clinic at the health department in the old Higdon building. Clinic hours will be from 8:30 a. m. to 4:30 p. m.

All persons who have been diagnosed as having tuberculosis and all persons who have been exposed to active cases of tuberculosis are eligible for and urged to attend this clinic. In order to avoid unnecessary crowding and waiting m the office, it is asked that those persons interested in having the examination call by the Franklin or Highlands office and make an appointment, or drop a card to the public health nurse, so a visit can be made for appointment.

Highlands office hours are from 8:30 a. m. to 12:30 noon in the school building. The office is open only on Tuesday in Highlands. Franklin office hours are from 8:30 a, m. to 5 p. m. and until 12:30 noon on Saturday, in the Higdon building.

To Clean Off Rush Graveyard

It is announced that those interested in the Rush graveyard will meet on Saturday, September 24, for the purpose of cleaning off the grounds. All who have relatives or friends buried there are urged to be present on that day with tools and basket lunches. Work is expected to begin at 8:30 a. m. and last until the cemetery is put into good condition.

Careless Cutting Is Ruinous To Woodland

A little care in the selection of wood for peanut poles and tobacco flue wood will prevent the removal make immediate settlement. of protective cover from land which might otherwise be subject to erosion, according to State Coordinator

E. B. Garrett of the soil conservation service.

Thousands of young pines are cut each year and used only for a few weeks as peanut poles, Garrett points out. Large numbers of other trees are also cut to provide flue wood for curing tobacco. In many cases steep slopes and erosible areas are clear cut, leaving no protection for the soil and very often no chance for reseeding.

There are other stands, however, which need thinning when the rate of growth begins to slow down. Such stands will be improved if poorly shaped and undesirable trees. are removed for use as peanut poles, tobacco flue food, or for cord wood as needed.

The more desirable trees will thus be left for a future crop of saw-
