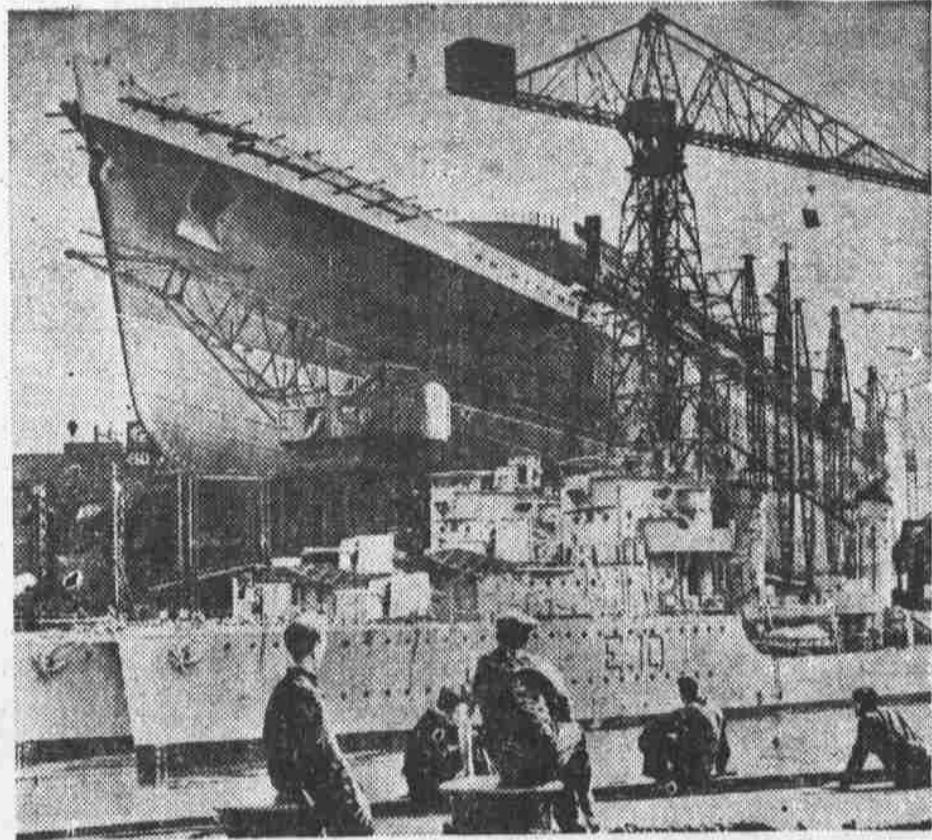

Now that school is keeping those youngsters indoors a lot, we have an even greater responsibility in supplying those avid appetites and maintaining sufficient nourishment. Herewith, we suggest a lunch menu that will delight and satisfy.

Lima Beans and Eggs au Gratin
Bread and Butter
Sliced Orange and Shredded Lettuce Salad
Caramel Custard
Milk or Hot Cocoa

LIMA BEANS AND EGGS AU GRATIN

2	tablespoons	Salt and
	butter	pepper
3½	tablespoons	1 cup grated
	flour	American
1	cup milk	cheese

1 No. 2 can or 2½ cups cooked lima beans
3 hard cooked eggs
Buttered soft bread crumbs

Melt the butter in a double boiler, add the flour and stir until well mixed. Add the milk combined with ½ cup of liquid from the lima beans and cook, stirring constantly until thickened. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Add ½ cup of the cheese and stir until cheese is melted. Add the drained lima beans and sliced eggs, mix lightly and pour into a buttered baking dish. Mix together the buttered crumbs and the remaining ½ cup of cheese and spread over the mixture in the baking dish. Bake in a moderate oven (350° F.) until cheese is melted and the mixture is hot. Serves six.
