Bryan McClure and sister, Miss Susan McClure, of Franklin Route 2, have gone to Lyman, Wash., for a visit with relatives and friends.

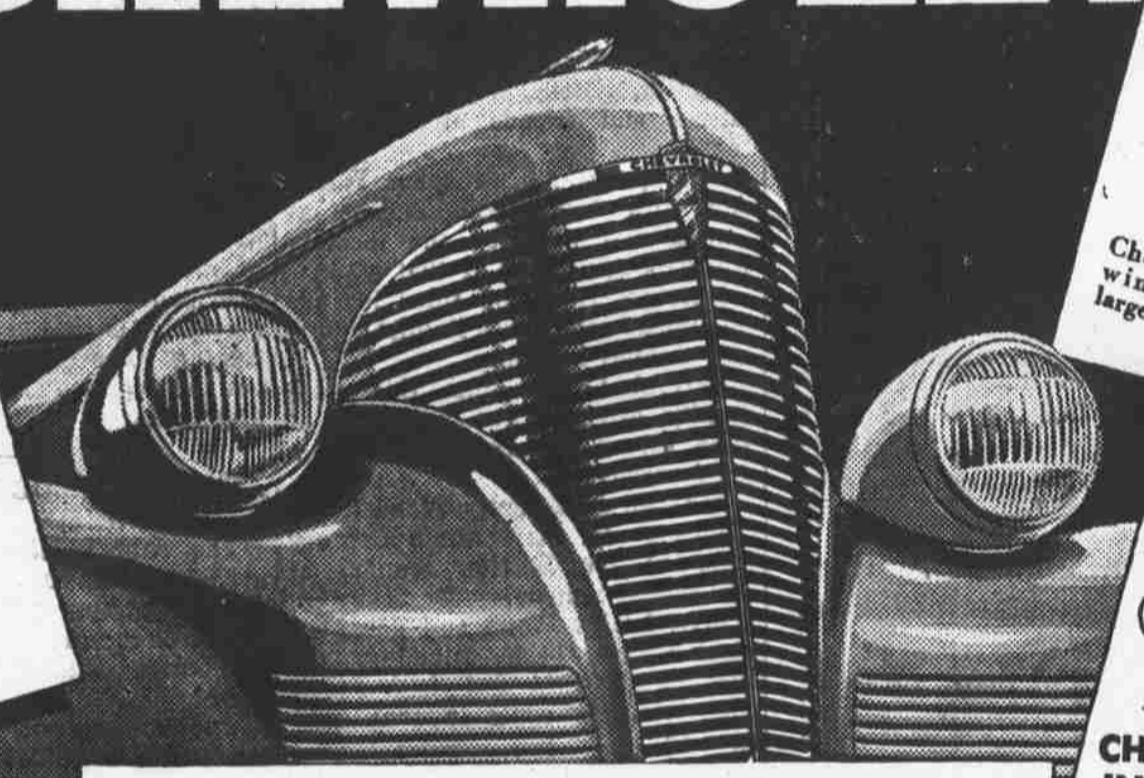
