Mrs. H. F. Hartley has returned to her home in Macon, Ga., after

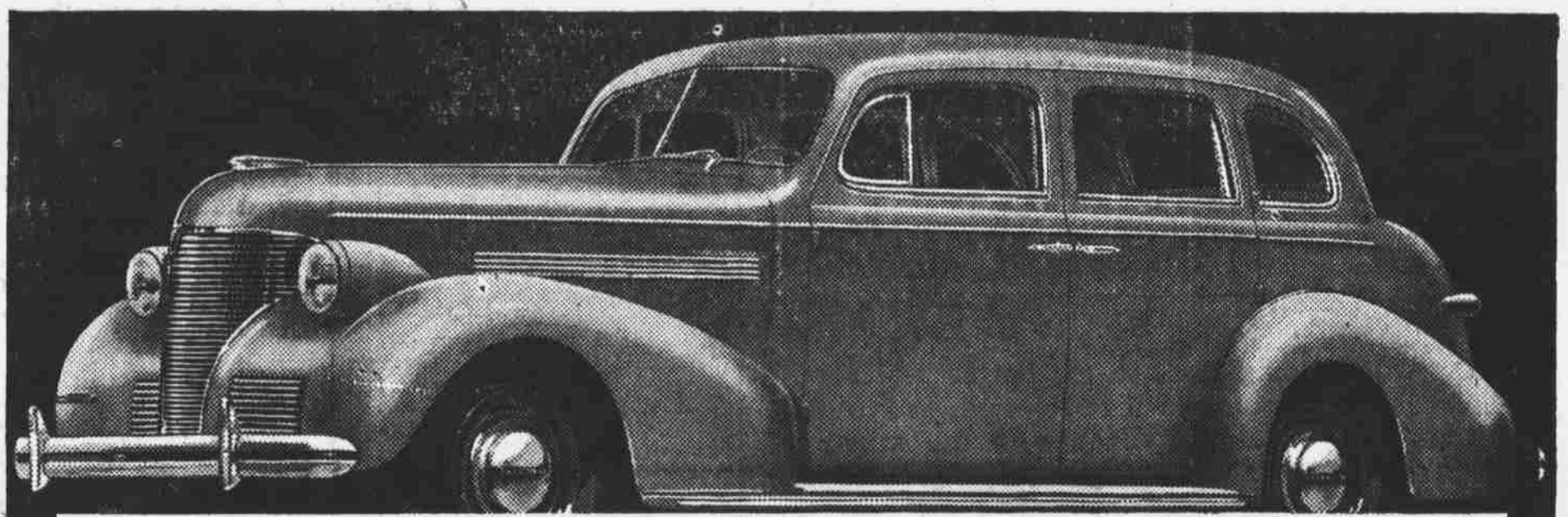
