At least 23 persons died as result of above 100-degree temperatures.

Schools were closed in many sections. Lightning started new forest fires, crop damage was widespread, and there was no immediate hope for relief. Temperature in Los Angeles was 107 degrees.

COURAGEOUS SUNK

Fifty-three survivors of the 20 million dollar British aircraft carrier Courageous, sunk by a German submarine off the coast of Ireland last Monday, were rescued by the American freighter, Colingsworth, and 400 by a British destroyer. Others were picked up by merchant vessels, 1,200 were aboard the carrier, 597 are dead or missing. The German command announced that the U-boat had escaped British bombs.

SCHWAB DIES

Chas. M. Schwab, 77, first president of the billion dollar U. S. Steel corporation, died in New York on Tuesday. Son of a mill hand, beginning at 18 driving stakes in a steel plant, the great steel magnate studied at night and gave piano lessons; at 21 became labor "trouble shooter" for Andrew Carnegie, and at 35 president of the Carnegie Steel company.

GALLUP POLL ON WAR

The American Institute of Public Opinion announces a late poll of Dr. Gallup as follows: Should U. S. send army and navy to fight Germany and Italy in case of war in Europe? Eighty-four per cent opposed. In answer to "Do you expect England, France and Poland to be defeated?" a nationwide poll reported 82 per cent who think they will win.

RAILROADS SPENDING

Federal Loan Administrator Jesse Jones said Monday the railroads "could and are spending" \$200,000,000 over the next six months for new equipment and repairs to meet any emergency transport demands.

PRESIDENT LAUDS SQUALUS SALVAGING

President Roosevelt has commended the salvage unit which rescued the survivors of the disaster to the submarine Squalus and after 113 days succeeded in

raising the craft and docking her at the Portsmouth Navy Yard.

KAISER'S GRANDSON KILLED IN ACTION

A grandson of former Kaiser Wilhelm—Prince Oskar, Jr., of Prussia—has been listed as "killed in action," the first Hohenzollern victim of the German-Polish war.

No bids of less than \$1.75 per M feet for sawtimber, and \$0.35 per unit for extractwood will be considered. \$100.00 must be deposited with each bid, to be applied on the purchase price, refunded, or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to the conditions of the sale.
