

ALL-STARS LOSE TO HAZELWOOD

Will Play Brevard Here Sunday Afternoon At 3 O'Clock

Failure to capitalize properly on their hitting power brought the Franklin All-Stars their sixth defeat to the season, 21-9, in a free-for-all slug-fest on the Hazelwood diamond last Sunday afternoon.

Franklin collected 21 hits, but poor coordination on the bases kept them out of the tally column for the greater part of the afternoon. Nichols started the game on the mound for the All-Stars, and was retired in the fourth in favor of Newton.

Burrell pitched the entire game for the Hazelwood nine.

Dalrymple, the All-Stars' crack short-stop, smashed one of Pitcher Burrell's offerings for a homer in the fifth with none aboard. The ball traveled 430 feet for what was said to be the longest hit ever made on the Hazelwood diamond. This Sunday afternoon, the All-

Stars meet the Brevard Tanners here on the high school field. The game will be called at 3 o'clock.

On the Fourth of July, Franklin will play host to the strong Knoxville All-Stars here. As a feature of the contest, a greased razor-back will be turned loose after the game, to go to the man who has what it takes to catch and subdue him. Admission to the game will entitle anyone to chase the pig.
