

# DEMOCRATS TO MEET ON SEPT. 7

## Broughton And Others To Address Hendersonville Rally

Although neither is on the ticket this time, both United States Senators from North Carolina will share speaking honors with J. Nelville Broughton, nominee for Gov-

ernor, when the Democrats launch their campaign with a three-district rally at Hendersonville on Saturday, September 7.

Several weeks ago, at the invitation of Monroe Redden, county chairman in Henderson, Broughton agreed to head-line the mountain rally and to officially start the Democratic campaign in North Carolina. At this time State headquarters in Raleigh will not, however, be officially opened until September 15 but E. B. Denny, who managed the Broughton campaign for the nomination and who was recently elected State chair-

man of the party, will go to Hendersonville for the opening.

Arch T. Allen, one of the most prominent young figures in the party, recently named by Chairman Denny as secretary, said today that the Hendersonville rally would be one of the major events of the 1940 campaign and unique in that it would last from 10:30 in the morning, with an intermission for a barbecue lunch, "until all the candidates and notables have had a chance to speak."

From Washington, in addition to Senators Bailey and Reynolds, will come Representative Zebulon

Weaver, host Congressman of the eleventh, and Representatives Bulwinkle and Doughton. All are veterans and war horses and none unfamiliar with forensic fighting against the Republicans.

All candidates for State offices up for election this year and Forrest Pollard, president of the State Young Democrats, will be at the Hendersonville rally, Allen said. The speaking will be on the Hendersonville high school grounds and advance information received by Denny and Allen indicate that more than 10,000 Democrats will attend and hear.
