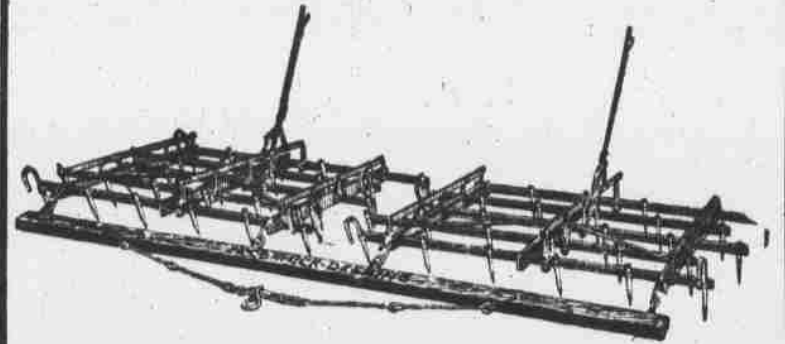
Red Cross Materials Expected This Week
