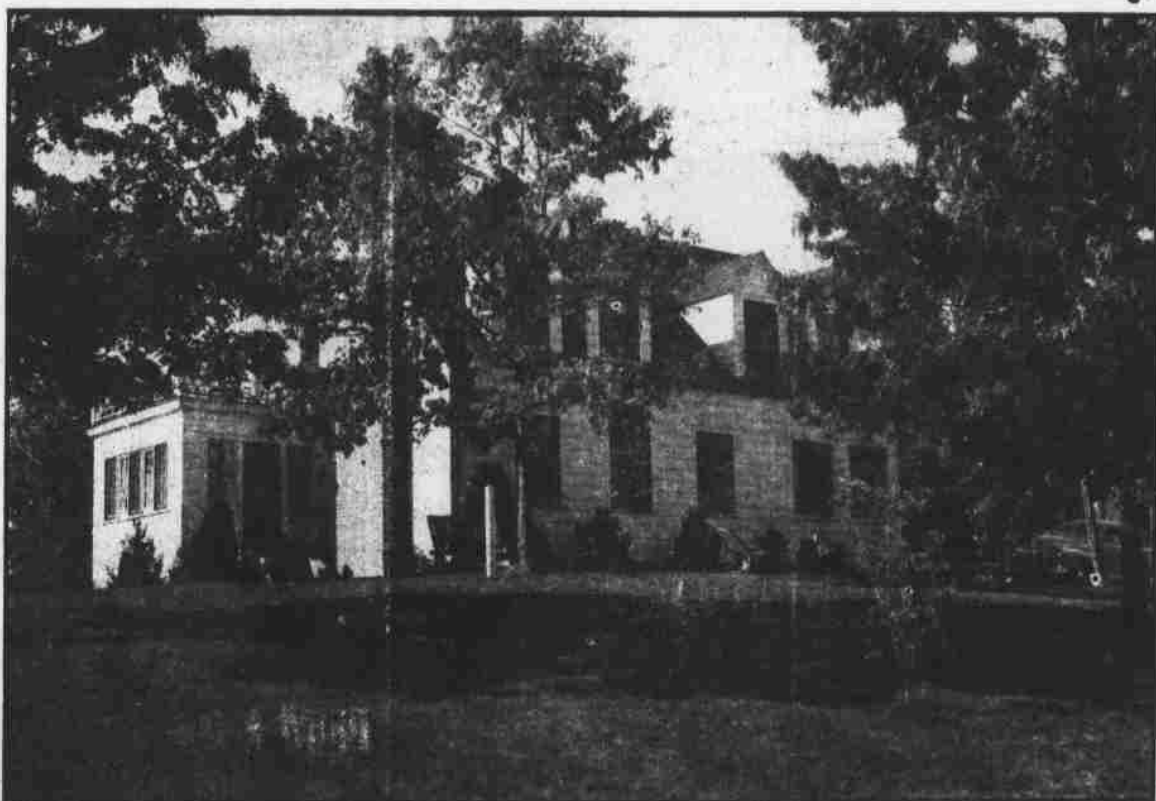

Expansion Of Service Has
Required Extension of
Toll Circuits

The rapid growth of the Franklin and Highlands exchanges of the Western Carolina Telephone company has necessitated continued expansion over the ten year period. This includes enlarged switchboard facilities and improved and enlarged outside plant facilities in the form of creosoted poles and lead covered cables.

Considerable increase in the number of toll circuits serving Highlands and Franklin has been one phase of the progress of the company. Toll circuits have tripled between Highlands and Sylva and an additional Franklin-Highlands circuit established. Also the increased toll facilities of the Southern Bell Telephone company in this area has provided more toll outlets.

The company has met demands for service at the Glenville project of the Nantahala Power and Light company, and has extended rural service to many small communities.
