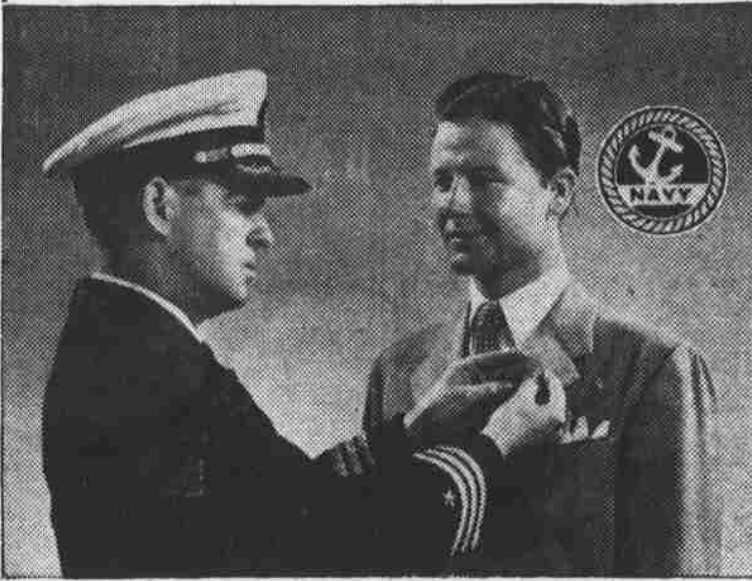


**U. S. NAVY RECRUITING OFFICER PRESENTS APPLICANT WITH NEW "BADGE OF HONOR"**

**Cakes to Catch Compliments**

5. Add eggs as directed in recipe.
6. All flour must be sifted once before measuring; measure and sift dry ingredients together.

8. Add dry ingredients alternately with the liquid, beginning and ending with the flour and beating after each addition just enough to mix.

  2. Add egg, beating thoroughly.
