Sealed bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, Franklin, North Carolina, up to and including February 23, 1942 for all the live timber marked or designated for cutting and all the merchantable dead timber located on areas embracing about 315 acres in the Corbin Cove-Laurel Branch Units, Ellijay Creek Watershed, Macon County, Nantahala National Forest, North Carolina, estimated to be 360 M feet, more or less, of yellow poplar, sugar maple, northern red oak, basswood, cucumber, white ash, white oak, black oak, chestnut oak, red maple, red gum, birch, scarlet oak and chestnut sawtimber, 500 units (160 cu. ft. per unit) of chestnut extractwood, and an unestimated amount of buckeye, black gum, and hickory sawtimber. The removal of buckeye, black gum, and hickory sawtimber and chestnut extractwood will be optional with the purchaser.
