POSTMASTER WARNS CHAIN LETTER WRITERS

Postmaster C. C. Potts calls attention to the penalty attached to chain letters soliciting defense stamps. Mr. Potts said: "This is to warn patrons that sending such matter through the mails is a violation of the postal fraud and lottery statutes. Notices are served upon persons participating in such schemes, whose names come to the attention of the Post Office Department, requiring them to show cause why fraud orders should not be issued against them. Such orders forbid the delivery of any mail to the persons named therein."
