**Will Begin Next Tuesday; Schedule Announced**

Harley R. Cabe Red Cross chairman, announces that nutrition classes will be taught in six communities beginning Tuesday April 28. kept firing till she blew up, all at once." He added, "A couple of subs were taken care of before they had any chance to do any damage."  
Then "Red" told one of those vivid impressions that flashes across the consciousness in moments of crisis, a trick of the imagination that is almost whimsical in the midst of intense strain. He said, "I saw the entire bow blown off the U. S. Destroyer, Shaw. Looking up, high in the sky, there was a steel door frame with the door opening and shutting—all by itself. I expected the Angel Gabriel to step through it any second. Since then the destroyer has been repaired for service."  
"The whole fleet went into action ten minutes after sighting the first Jap plane," he said.  
**Spirit Of Navy**  
With the spirit of the navy, young Watkins cited that the navy has never lost a soldier in convoy, proudly referring to the great honor the navy had of transporting General MacArthur to Australia. He shared the devotion that every American soldier and seaman gives to their chief, who, this seaman says, is brave to the point of carelessness. When it was suggested that the flag over his tent on Bataan might be a target for sharpshooters, he is reported to have said, "I think the boys will take the necessary precautions, but leave the flag there, I kinder like to see it."  
This young navy man, trained, alert and full of pride in his calling, typifies, one likes to think, the ever-increasing number of America's recruits, whose unconquerable spirit behind their straight shooting is going to win this war.

**Vacation Bible School Conference On May 1**

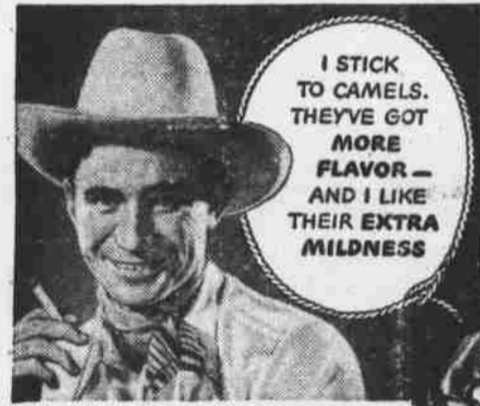
