C. T. Sanders' Funeral Last Friday

Funeral services were held last Friday afternoon, August 14, for C. T. Sanders, 28, of the South Skeenah section of Macon county, who was found dead Thursday evening about 6 o'clock.

The services were held at the home of his mother with the Rev. James Sanders officiating. Burial was in the family cemetery in the Skeenah community.

Officers, who investigated the death, said Mr. Sanders went to the home of his brother, Ernest, Wednesday afternoon and, finding no one at home, spent the night there alone. Death was viewed at suicide by Sheriff Slagle and Coroner Zeb Shope, and it was announced no inquest would be held.

The body was found by Steve Stockton at the home. The investigating officers found a 16-gauge shotgun near the body and expressed the opinion he placed the gun muzzle near his heart and discharged the weapon. Sheriff Slagle was quoted as

Reports Made And Officers Installed At Baptist Church

Four years ago the congregation gave \$661.13 for Missions, while this year the figure was \$1,313.93.
