Sealed bids will be received by the Regional Forester, Glenn Building, Atlanta, Georgia, up to and not later than 2 p. m., April 5, 1943, and opened immediately thereafter, for all live timber marked or designated for cutting and all merchantable dead timber located on areas embracing about 4,650 acres within the Cowee Creek Units, Little Tennessee River Watershed, Macon County, Nantahala National Forest, North Carolina, estimated to be 3,675 M feet, more or less, of northern red oak, sugar maple, black cherry, white ash, basswood, cucumber, white oak, birch, red maple, chestnut oak, black oak, pitch pine, chestnut, black locust, butternut, beech, hemlock, scarlet oak, buckeye, and black walnut sawtimber and 200 tons of tanbark of chestnut oak and hemlock, more or less. No bid of less than \$9.00 for northern red oak, sugar maple, black cherry, white ash, basswood, and cucumber; \$7.00 for white oak; \$5.00 for birch and red maple; \$2.00 for chestnut oak, black oak, pitch pine, chestnut, black locust, butternut and beech; \$1.00 for hemlock, scarlet oak, and buckeye; and \$30.00 for black walnut sawtimber; and \$1.50 per ton (2,000 lbs.) for tanbark will be considered. No package or papers may be mailed to men in the armed services at any overseas base unless a written request from the man himself, signed by his commanding officer from the foreign station where he is located may be mailed. This is a necessary ruling in view of transportation difficulties and overcrowding of foreign mail facilities, it is stated.
