Asked what were the benefits received here from being in the territory of the Tennessee Valley Authority, Mr. Mendenhall explained that the assistant farm agent receives his salary from the appropriation granted to State College which works in cooperation with the North Carolina Extension service, especially in the field of crop rotation and soil conservation.

Another benefit is the allowance phosphate manufactured by the TVA power development at Muscle Shoals to improve farm lands.
