

# MACON EXPECTS LARGE CROPS

## Labor Shortage Solved Through Neighbor Organizations

"The labor shortage will not be felt in Macon county as acutely as most places", said Sam Mendenhall, county agent, in commenting on the labor situation here. "I think we will be able to handle the harvesting problem through the method of swapping help which has been developed through neighborhood leaders and organization".

The drought and later, the excessive rains, have not materially affected the crops. Indications are that there is more acreage and that more food will be produced in the county than ever before, he stated.

### TVA Benefits

Asked what were the benefits received here from being in the territory of the Tennessee Valley Authority, Mr. Mendenhall explained that the assistant farm agent receives his salary from the appropriation granted to State College which works in cooperation with the North Carolina Extension service, especially in the field of crop rotation and soil conservation.

Another benefit is the allowance of phosphate manufactured by the TVA power development at Muscle Shoals to improve farm lands.
