Suggests Tasty New Method Of Serving Liver

- Savory Liver Pie**
- 1 pound sliced liver
 - 2 tablespoons margarine or drippings
 - 2 tablespoons flour
 - 1 1/2 cups water in which liver is cooked
 - 2 tablespoons chopped celery
 - 1/2 cup sliced olives
 - 1 teaspoon salt
 - 1/4 teaspoon paprika
 - 1 tablespoon Worcestershire Sauce
 - 2 hard-cooker eggs
 - Biscuit dough
- Drop liver into water enough to cover, and simmer 5 minutes. Drain (retaining the liquid) and cut in 1/2-inch cubes. Melt fat, blend in flour and add liquid gradually, stirring until thickened. Add liver, celery, olives, seasonings, and chopped eggs. Put in greased casserole. Cover with biscuit dough. Bake in hot oven (425 deg. F.) until crust is done. Serves 6.
