**Amounts Given Red Cross By Various Areas**

The amounts contributed by the various communities in this county in the recent Red Cross campaign have been announced by Bob S. Sloan, county chairman.

Of the total amount raised, Franklin and Highlands naturally contributed the larger shares, but Mr. Sloan emphasized that the "gratifying total could not have been reached without the donations from every community."

Franklin's total was \$1,562.37, while Highlands raised \$1,538.46. The totals from other communities in the county follow: Burningtown, \$5; Union, \$7.56; Iotla, \$28.73; West's Mill-Cowee, \$220.57; Buck Creek ranch, \$2.50; Otto, \$128.40; Higdonville, \$21; Patton Settlement, \$18.50; Cullasaja, \$27; Holly Springs, \$6; Cartoogechaye, \$114.56; Walnut Creek, \$4.75; Mashburn Branch, \$6.41; Nantahala, \$15.40; Ridgecrest, \$12.30; Tellico, \$22.94; Pine Grove, \$26.50; Gold Mine, \$32.40; Lower Cartoogechaye, \$60; Leatherman, \$25.15; and Sealy, \$16.27.

**Zickgraf Band Mill Destroyed By Blaze**

an addition to the building had been constructed.  
In addition to the mill, a carload of dimension lumber for manufacture of furniture was

burned.  
None of the equipment within the mill was saved, officials said.

The Zickgraf company, owned by W. C. Zickgraf and his son, Grant Zickgraf, has been in operation here for about 12 years. During the war, it was employed exclusively on war work, and now 75 per cent of its production is lumber for use in meeting the housing emergency, practically all of which is distributed in Macon county. It normally turns out about 30,000 feet per day.

The fire was the worst here since the disastrous blaze of 1940 that destroyed the Bank of Franklin building.  
Lumber production rose considerably in January and there were substantial increases in output of other building materials from previous low levels.

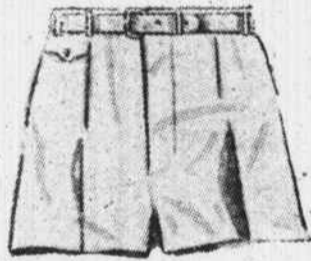
