grounds, however, the owners said, explaining that they plan to do this during the winter.

The Cagles, who were their own contractors, remarked on the difficulty they had in completing the plant. The foundations were laid prior to the issuance of the current restrictions on buildings, but that did not make materials any easier to find, and one or the other of the brothers was traveling most of the time during the construction, seeking materials and equipment. By the time the work was completed, the court had cost approximately \$25,000, they said.
