GET HORSE IN FRONT OF CART. DIXON URGES

Assistant Agent Gives 11 Reasons Why Pastures Are Profitable

With a longtime livestock program ahead of us, we need to get the horse out in front of our cart.

Get our pastures well on their way and the cattle will come into the picture—and make a better picture.

Reasons for pastures:

1. Cheapest feed a livestock farmer can produce.
2. Sod crops are our best soil conservation.
3. High conservation of our manure.
4. We produce feed throughout the year.
5. Excellent source of vitamins, grasses and legumes.
6. Excellent conditions for livestock, keeps cows thrifty at all times.
7. May utilize wasteland.
8. Pasture plants are highest in protein and minerals, orchard grass and clovers running as high as 25 to 30 per cent protein in early spring to 10 to 20 per cent in latter summer.
9. Pastures are higher in total digestible nutrients.
10. No feeding loss, the more pastures we have, the less silage and hay we will need, as well as concentrates.
11. Sod crops most effective means of building up organic matter, fastest rate known to man.

Different legumes and grasses may be used with good results throughout the country.

Mixtures that are recommended for our mountain climate, soils, and rainfall are:

- (a) 10 pounds orchard grass 15 pounds lespedeza, and one to two pounds white clover.
- (b) 12-20 pounds orchard grass and two to four pounds Ladino clover.
- (c) 3 pounds red top, 12 pounds orchard grass, 6 pounds Kentucky bluegrass, 6 pounds lespedeza and one pound white clover.

Orchard grass and ladino are coming up to the top in our pasture mixes. Legume and grasses penetrate to different depths in our soil, thus giving better utilization. The grasses preventing bloat in our cattle, the legumes taking the nitrogen out of the air and storing it in the soil, later releasing it for the grasses, causing us to use less nitrogen in our pasture fertilizer. Orchard grass is preferred to Kentucky bluegrass for seeding because it establishes a stand more quickly, it is more responsive to fertilization, and it is more tolerant to lespedeza. However, Kentucky bluegrass should be used on the steeper slopes for reseeding.

Ladino clover is one of our newer pasture crops. "White clover with a college education." Results with it are proving very successful. It is larger than white clover and has a much greater recovery capacity, leaning more to production rather than reproduction. Blossom, stems, and leaves of ladino clover go up to as much as three to four times as large as white clover. The under side of the leaf and stems have a more oily

appearance, yet leading agronomists sometimes, fail to separate the ladino from white clover.

Reports from the ladino over the country sound like these, "I fed 35 cows on seven acres and the cows had their fill in one hour"; "I grazed 40 head of cows on 20 acres except two weeks last year"; "Big rank growing, graze it to the ground this week and it is up again the next"; "It will carry more cattle to the acre than any other clovers they have tried".

TIPS ON THINGS TO DO TO LOWER COST OF FEEDS

Mendenhall Suggests Lists Of Farm Jobs For This Period

Now is the time for all farmers to do less talking and more action, about the high cost of feed. There probably is not much that can be done to bring the price of feed down, but there are crops that can be grown to take the place of store bought feed.

The permanent pasture is the backbone of a sound livestock program and will provide about 50 per cent of the total feed at 15 per cent of the total cost. It is wise to plan on one to two acres of improved pasture per animal to be grazed. Twenty pounds of orchard grass and two pounds of ladino clover seeded per acre in a well pulverized seedbed on good land that has had lime and a complete fertilizer applied should go a long way in solving your feed problem.

Supplementary grazing for fall, winter and spring will stop the accumulation of empty feed sacks in the barn, will bring

Funeral Conducted For Infant Son Of Mr. and Mrs. Mason

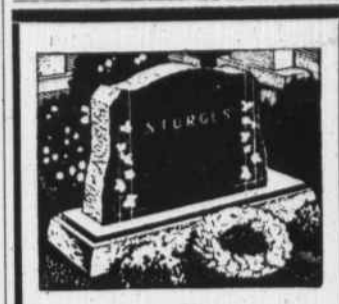
