

## **Uses Macon Products** To Build Summer Home

#### Atlanta Man Undismayed By Regulations And Shortages

By GUY PAUL, JR. (Formerly of Highlands, now a journalism student at the University of North Carolina)

In the planning and building of his summer home, which is nearing completion at Whiteside View, near Highlands, Harold N. Cooledge, of Atlanta, Ga., has illustrated conclusively what can be accomplished in spite of the nation-wide shortage of building materials, by the use of a little imagination and the native resources and products of Macon County.

Unreconciled to the Red Tape and Anxiety of long waiting lists, Charactistic of the postreconversion period, intent upon having his home ready for occupancy by next spring, Mr. Cooledge torged anead with the materials at hand and has found that expediency is not bad at all.

From the sond rock of Whiteside Mountain, in which it is anchored, so the peak of the vermiculite roof, the products of Macon County have been utilized to make one of the most attractive and most durable homes in this section.

The outside walls, all of the partitions and even the floors of concrete blocks, manufactured scientifically in large numbers at Franklin.

The Roof, supported by welded boiler tubes, is made of vermiculite, a product of the vermiculite deposits peculiar to the Ellijay section of Macon Coun-ty. Scarce materials, such as lumber, nails, roofing and Hooring, have been ruled out altogether.

Perhaps not since the Horse and buggy days, when the early settlers of Macon County when the pushed over the mountains and down the valleys and erected their homes out of boards hewn by their own hands, has a home been built in this area with so great a percentage of the materials coming directly out this county.

Almost all counties could do the same in the horse and buggy days, but it is unlikely that many of them can equal Macon County in this regard Jo-

This fact alone sets the home of Mr. Cooledge off as a mile-stone in the annals of Macon county construction, a milestone which the people of Macon county can look to with a double sense of pride in these days of so much dilemma in the field
