State College Answers Timely Farm Questions

Q. Will the exhibits at the State Fair again be on a community basis?
 A. No, say H. L. Meacham and W. G. Booker, who are directing the farm exhibits at the fair this year. The individual farm is to be featured. Exhibit space is to be 16 feet frontage and 12 feet deep. Each farmer interested in entering an exhibit

is urged to have attractive and educational exhibits. Judging will be, in a large matter, on that basis.

Q. Should I be prepared for killing frosts in North Carolina during September?
 A. No, unless you live in the extreme northwestern mountain counties, and even there, killing frosts do not occur annually in September, say extension specialists at State college. At Parker, in Ashe county, elevation 4,075 feet, in only eight out of the 28 years that the weather bureau has kept records, killing frosts have occurred in September. The earliest date recorded was September 6, but as a rule, they occur only in the last 10 days of the month if at all.

Q. How can I keep my livestock from poisoning themselves on the poisonous plants that will crop up near pastures?

A. First of all, you should learn how to identify the stock-poisoning plants so that you can destroy them before your livestock feed on them. The N. C. agricultural experiment station has prepared a handy guide, giving illustrations of the most common of these plants, descriptions of them, poisoning symptoms, and treatments. Send for your free copy so that you can be prepared before winter comes when poisoning is more prevalent because of the scarcity of other plants. Recipes

Of Maccn Women Now In Book Form

Members of the Cartoogechaye and Carson Chapel Home Demonstration clubs have just received their revised, printed edition of the recipe book entitled, "Favorite Recipes of the Cartoogechaye and Carson Chapel Home Demonstration Clubs of Macon County."

Five years ago mimeographed copies were compiled for the club members. To their surprise, recipe books were sent as gifts to every section of the United States. At Farm and Home week in Raleigh in 1941, copies were on sale by 4-H Club Girls Myra Slagle and Emma Lou Hurst, and part of the funds were used to send Miss Hurst to Chicago to attend the 4-H club congress as "Health Queen of North Carolina." These books were also exhibited at the Western Carolina fair in Hendersonville that year.

The members of the clubs wanted a revised edition that was printed and that would mention Macon County, since everyone did not know where Cartoogechaye and Carson Chapel were located.

One thousand copies are now available, with tested recipes, from "beverages" to "household needs."

Committee members who selected the recipes and arranged the book are Mrs. Earl Harrison, president of the Cartoogechaye club, Mrs. H. E. Freas, and Mrs. Carl Slagle, Mrs. J. R. Ray, president of the Carson Chapel club, Mrs. Leona W. Moore, and Miss Ethel Hurst.
