

Kelsey Seeks To Make Park Of Noted Peak

Harlan Kelsey, whose father was closely associated with the early history of Highlands, is conducting a private campaign for funds to buy Grandfather mountain, near Linville, so that it can be given to the federal government for development as a national park.

Mr. Kelsey, a botanist, has long resided at Boxford, Mass., but is a native of Western North Carolina.

Fearing that the famous mountain inevitably will be robbed of much of its beauty under private ownership, he has come back South to seek its purchase and preservation as a park.

Already Governor Cherry and former Governor Broughton have promised him help in obtaining an appropriation from the general assembly, and he believes the remainder of the \$165,000 price can be obtained by private subscriptions. The National Park service has agreed to take over the mountain and incorporate it into the Blue Ridge parkway.

Mr. Kelsey served on the commissions which succeeded in creating the Great Smokies, the Shenandoah, and the Mammoth Cave national parks.
