Miss Joyce Sutherland, of Ashe county, has been appointed assistant home demonstration agent for this county and took up her new work here this week. She will work with Mrs. Florence S. Sherrill, Macon County home agent.

She succeeds Miss Marie Scott, who recently resigned to accept appointment as home agent in Avery county.

Miss Sutherland comes here from Watauga County, where she served as home demonstration agent during the past year.

A native of Ashe county she was graduated from the Cold Creek High school in Watauga, attended Winthrop college, at Rock Hill, S. C., for a year, and was graduated from Appalachian State Teachers college at Boone, where she majored in home economics and science.

After two years, as a teacher of home economics and science in Stokes and Ashe counties, she went to Washington, D. C., where she served for a year and a half during the war as a clerk in the State department. From Washington, she returned to North Carolina to enter home demonstration work in Watauga county.

Miss Sutherland has taken an apartment in the Leach apartment house on West Main street, where her mother, Mrs. Charlie Sutherland, of Creston, Ashe county, is spending a fortnight with her.
