Fire Destroys Home Of McCall

The Sam McCall home, about two and a half miles from Franklin, on the Highlands road, burned to the ground about 6 o'clock last Friday morning.

The fire was discovered by Boyce Hall, Asheville Citizen-Times representative, who gave the alarm to the family. The structure burned within a short time.

Representatives of the Red Cross visited the McCalls Friday morning to give assistance, and arranged for the family to be provided with food and needed clothing.

By coincidence, the home of another Sam McCall, in Horse Cove, also burned Friday, but no details were learned here.
