**Last Word On Searing Meat — Don't Do It**

The old theory that searing meat "hold in the juices" has definitely been disproved by scientific experiments. When meat is seared, a high temperature is used; and it has been learned that very high temperatures actually increase the loss of juices from the meat.  
This discovery has brought about a change in the cooking of meat by various methods, says Reba Staggs, home economist. Nowadays, the accepted method of cooking a roast is to use a constant low temperature. The oven may be preheated or not, as desired; but the temperature should be regulated to remain the same throughout the entire cooking period. An oven temperature of 300 deg. F. is recommended for beef, veal, lamb, and smoked pork. Fresh pork roasts are best cooked at a temperature of 350 deg. F.  
Searing has also been abandoned in the case of broiled and panbroiled meats, including tender beef steaks.


