First, there is to be a regular inspection of motor vehicles made by inspection stations operated by the Department of motor vehicles. Unless these stations issue to each owner a certificate of approval the inspect-ed car may be taken from the highways until such times that its defects have been corrected.

The inspection stations will be located as conveniently as pos-sible for the motoring public. During the year of 1948 each

motor vehicle, trailer and semitrailer registered in North Carolina shall be inspected one time by the department of motor vehicles. After renewal of the license, the operator's license will automatically expire on the birthday of the license in the fourth year following its issuance, and a new license will not be issued until the operator has again passed the specified examination. The fee to be charged the

Third, there has been a new speed limit set for North Carolina-a maximum of 55 MPH on the highway, subject to "No and that his conduct and atti-person shall drive a vehicle on tude is such as to entitle him a highway at a greater speed than is reasonable and prudent under the conditions then ex-isting." This provision should be kept in mind when noting the

following speed limits:
1. 20 MPH in any business district. 2. 35 MPH in any residential

district. 3. 45 MPH in places other than those named in Paragraphs 1 and 2 of this subsection for vehicles other than passenger cars, regular passenger vehicles, pick-up trucks of less than one ton capacity, and school busses loaded with children.

4. 55 MPH in places other than those named in Paragraphs 1 and 2 of this subsection for passenger cars, regular passenger carrying vehicles, and pick-up trucks of less than one ton capacity.

The State Highway and Public Works commission shall determine on a basis of engineer-ing and traffic investigation what speeds shall be deemed safe under existing conditions. Suspensions

To the authority of the motor vehicle department to suspend licenses the following two sections are added:

If a driver: 1. Has, within one year, been convicted of two or more charges of speeding in excess of 55 and not more than 75 miles per hour, or of one or more charges of reckless driving and one or more charges of speeding in excess of 55 and not

more than 75 miles per hour.

2. Has been convicted of operating a motor vehicle at a speed in excess of 75 miles per hour.

When a license is suspended under No. 1 above, it shall not be for less than 60 days nor more than six months. When license is suspended under No. 2 above, it shall not be for less one year.

In regard to operating a mo-tor vehicle under the influence of intoxicating liquor or narcot-

because of a second conviction for driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor or a nar-cotic drug, the depatment shall not grant application for a new license until the expiration of three years.

2. When a license is revoked because of a third conviction for ariving under the influence of intoxicating liquor or a narcotic drug, the department shall never grant application for a new expire June 30 of each year and license: Provided, that the department may, after the expiration of five years, grant an application for a new license upon satisfactory proof that the former licensee has been of good behavior for the past five years, to favorable consideration.
