Reflecting the drastic reduc-tion the recent session of congress made in Department of Agriculture appropriations, the total for the local forest is \$112,-000 below the \$258,791 figure last year. This represents a cut of than 40 per cent in the \$10.132. more Nantahala's allotment.

These figures, of course, are subject to additional appropriations that may be made avail-able by congress later.

The announcement was made by the supervisor in connection with the forest's annual work planning conference, at which the year's work is outlined on a basis of funds available. The forest has \$91,117 for district; and John Wasilik, Jr., general administration, includ-




