



FIRST IN RUBBER

TRUNK

1. The interior of the trunk is finished on the floor, with a rubber-backed carpet, and the sides are trimmed with panels of heavy fiberboard. A trunk light in the lid turns on auto-matically when the trunk lid is opened, provided the headlight switch is in the "on" position.

There are six different color interior upholstery and trim combinations and seven exterior paint schemes. Five of the latter are two tone and the remaining two are solid colors. All of these exterior paints utilize metallic and non-metallic synthetic enamel.
