# BAPTISTS NAME Handicapped Need Not Ask Public's Aid

If the salesman at your door appeals to you to buy his magazines or other merchandise because he is blind or crippled and needs help in raising money for an operation or medical treatment, think twice before you reach for your purse, advises the State Board of Public Welfare.

Many persons are making di-rect appeals by exploiting the sympathy of well persons for handicapped individuals or the sympathy of adults for extremeyoung salesmen, welfare of-

For several years certain publishing or magazine subscription firms have exploited crippled persons and the North Carolina public by using physically handicapped salesmen. In this method of sales the sales appeal is based on the solicitor's handicap and need for charitable assistance for corrective treatment, rather than a valid sales appeal based on the merits of the magizine offered and its value to the subscriber.

For a number of years both the federal and state governments have maintained a program of vocational rehabilitation for the physically handicapped, which was intensified and expanded with the enactment of the federal social security measures

During the last year or so the program of rehabilitation has been further liberalized by expanding the age limits and pro-
