

Jobs Found For 3,744 Handicapped Veterans

Jobs in which their abilities can be used effectively were found for 3,744 handicapped workers, 2,539 of them disabled, in the first eight months of this year through local Employment Service offices, according to Ernest C. McCracken, director of the North Carolina State Employment Service division of the Employment Security commission, and R. C. Godwin, state veterans employment representative, heading the Veterans Employment service in the state.

Season Extended On Quail, Rabbit, Grouse

Extension of the closing date of the quail and rabbit season in the western part of the state and of the ruffed grouse season was adopted by the North Carolina Wildlife Resources commission after a public hearing in Asheville last week.

Quail and rabbit season, which were originally scheduled to close on January 1, now will remain open through January 31. Grouse season was also extended to remain open through January 31.

Macon is one of 23 counties affected by this change.

Auto Accident Death Toll Shows Decrease
