HAVE OODLES OF NOODLES!

WANT SPECIAL MEET OF N. C. LEGISLATURE

McGlamery And 3 Other Solons Write Letter To Gov. Cherry

Herbert A. McGlamery, Macon County representative, has joined three other state legislators in a letter to Governor Cherry, urging him to call a special session of the general assembly to consider pay increases for teachers and other state employees.

Signers of the letter, in addition to Mr. McGlamery, were Rep. Bruce A. Elmore, of Swain county, and Senator Frank M. Parker and Rep. Hency C. Fisher, both of Buncombe. Mr. McGlamery and Mr. Elmore both are presently living in Asheville.

The letter to Governor Cherry cited the fact that the state is receiving more revenue than was anticipated and the increased cost of living for teachers and other state employees as reasons why salary increases should be considered at this time.

The text of the letter follows: "For some time it has been evident, according to the reports of the revenue department, that the revenue return to the state has far exceeded the anticipated yield.

"It likewise was apparent that the school teachers and state employes of North Carolina were being woefully and inadequately paid for their services and it also was evident that it was the disposition of the majority of the members of the legisla-

ture to increase the salaries of these indispensable servants of the state the maximum the state revenue would permit.

"Now that it is an established fact that the state is in a position to further increase the salaries without detriment to the very comprehensive program of the state, we the undersigned members of the 1947 session of the legislature, representing Buncombe county or residing here, desire to take this means of urging you as chief executive of this state to call a special session of the legislature in order that we can further increase the compensation of these worthy and deserving servants of the people."

National Forest Timber For Sale

Sealed bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, Franklin, North Carolina, up to and not later than 2:00 p. m. April 5, 1948 and opened immediately thereafter for all the merchantable live and dead timber designated for cutting on an area embracing about 500 acres within the Brush Creek Unit, Cullasaja River watershed, Macon County, Nantahala National Forest, North Carolina, estimated to be 2000 cords (128 cubic feet) of chestnut extract-wood, more or less. No bid of less than 50 cents per cord will be considered. In addition to price bid for stumpage, a deposit of 10c per cord for all wood cut will be required for sale area betterment work. \$300 must be deposited with each bid, to be applied on the purchase price, refunded, or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to conditions of sale. The right to reject any and all bids reserved. Before bids are submitted, full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale and the submission of bids should be obtained from the Forest Supervisor, Franklin, North Carolina.
