Recruiting Station Here Far Exceeds Quota For February

The Franklin army and air force recruiting station enlisted 171 per cent of number assigned to it for February, it was learned this week from Sgt. James R. Dance, who heads the station here. Recruiting in the two Carolinas was 151 per cent ahead of the quota.

Sgt. Dance also announced that he has received a list of 600 vacancies at the army installations throughout the United States, to be filled by veterans of World War 2 desiring to enlist for direct assignment to a specific installation in this country.
