**FARM INCOME
IN N. C. DROPS**

State One Of 4 In U. S.
Where Farm Receipts
Took Tumble

North Carolina is one of only four states in the nation whose cash receipts from farm marketing showed a decrease during 1947, according to C. Brice Ratchford, extension farm management specialist at State college.

Although receipts for the nation as a whole rose 23 per cent—from \$24,500,000,000 in 1946 to \$30,200,000,000 in 1947—the farm income in North Carolina showed a decrease of \$9,200,000, Mr. Ratchford said. The only other states showing a decrease were Delaware, South Carolina, and Florida.

Receipts from North Carolina crops during 1947 were \$32,000,000 less, primarily caused by lower prices for tobacco, but receipts from livestock and live-stock products increased \$22,500,000, the specialist added.

A large market basket provides a handy container in which to keep cleaning supplies. Soap powder, polishes, cleaning cloths, small brushes, and other articles are conveniently stored in one place.

To keep tools and nails from rolling off the top of a step-ladder, simply nail a strip of inner tube around it in such a manner that it will form a shallow tray.

To store bowls, platters, and odd dishes without stacking them, remember that a group of "stepped" shelves is useful.

A nut pick should have a place in every kitchen; it may be used to remove corks, to punch holes in sifting-cans, to untie hard knots, and to clean seams in milk pails and other utensils. Cherries or small pickles, too, may be easily removed from their containers with a nut pick.

Tongs are a useful addition to kitchen equipment and are especially efficient for turning meats, cakes, and pies in oven, and excellent to use in rinsing dishes.

To prevent pictures from marking the wall—When hanging pictures, place a thumb-tack on the back of the pictures at each of the lower corners. This will hold the picture far enough from the wall so that it will not leave a mark. Picture rearrangement is thus permitted from year to year.

When turkish towels have become worn or faded, simply cut them in squares and keep them to use as dishcloths.
