

### Motor Vehicle

#### Auto Inspection Law

(This is one of a series of the motoring public with articles designed to acquaint the requirements of the Motor Vehicle Inspection program).

**RALEIGH.** — Every motorist who owns a vehicle more than 80 inches wide, must see that that vehicle is equipped with clearance lamps before it can be approved by the State's mechanical inspection lanes.

In addition, owners of trailers or semi-trailers must equip them with reflex-reflectors.

The following requirements are set forth in the Manual of the Motor Vehicle mechanical inspection requirements:

**Clearance Lights:** "Every vehicle having a width at any part in excess of 80 inches shall carry two clearance lamps at the front, one at each side, reflecting an amber light plainly visible under normal atmospheric conditions from a distance of 500 feet to the front of said vehicle and two clearance lamps at the rear; one on each side and reflecting a red light visible under like conditions from a distance of 500 feet to the rear of the vehicle."

**Reflex Reflectors:** "Trailers or semi-trailers over 2,500 pounds gross shall carry at least one reflex-reflector as approved by the commissioner. In addition to the regular tail light located as to a height and maintained as to be visible at least 500 feet when approached by a motor vehicle displaying lawful undimmed headlights at night on an unlighted highway."

"Trailers under 2,500 pounds gross shall carry two red reflect-reflectors, each not less than four inches in diameter and to be of a type approved by the commissioner and which are so located as to height and maintained so as for each reflector to be visible for at least 500 feet when approached by a motor vehicle displaying lawful undimmed headlights at night on an unlighted highway."

The Manual further states that "all vehicle light switches and wiring shall comply with the approved assembly requirements and shall be in good working order and in accordance with original design. All wiring must be maintained in good safe condition."

#### Army Aviation Cadet Class To Start Soon

Applications are now being taken for the next class of Aviation Cadets, which will start training in July of this year, according to a statement issued today by Sgt. Dance, of the Franklin Army and Air Force Recruiting station. This class is expected to consist of 1040 men.

Upon graduation from the Aviation Cadet school the young men will be commissioned pilots and Second Lieutenants in the United States Air Force and will receive a minimum salary of \$336.00 per month plus \$500.00 per year bonus for each year of active duty with the Air Force. In addition, each graduate will be given an allowance of \$250.00 for uniform upon graduating from the school.

While attending the school the cadets will receive \$75.00 per month, \$10,000 of free life insurance, and free meals, quarters, medical and dental care uniforms and equipment.

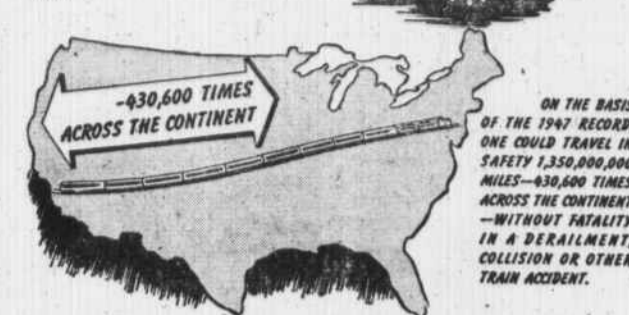
