1948 Trout Fishing Schedule Given For Nantahala Area Carpenter To Head

dule for the North Carolina and 31; August 1, 21-22, 28-29. United States Cooperative Wildlife Management areas in the Nantahala national forest was released last week by Paul Russell, assistant forest supervisor.

In releasing the new schedule, Mr. Russell pointed out that the main change from last year's program was that Cliffside Lake would be open for fishing every June, July and August. The hours for Monday through Friday will be \$1.00. License day will be \$2.00. day will be 9 a. m. to 7 p. m. and 6 a. m. to 7 p. m. on Saturdays, and holidays. The forest service officials said that the lake would be restocked at various times during the summer according to how fast the fish

were taken out by anglers. He added that according to reports the upper reaches of Fires creek in Clay county was particularly well stocked this year with a carry over from last year and that the real sportsman would find the fishing more to his liking there, he believed, than in the other areas. 
