1948 Trout Fishing Schedule Given For Nantahala Area

The 1948 trout fishing schedule for the North Carolina and United States Cooperative Wildlife Management areas in the Nantahala national forest was released last week by Paul Russell, assistant forest supervisor.

In releasing the new schedule, Mr. Russell pointed out that the main change from last year's program was that Cliffside Lake would be open for fishing every day through the months of June, July and August. The hours for Monday through Friday will be 9 a. m. to 7 p. m. and 6 a. m. to 7 p. m. on Saturdays, and holidays. The forest service officials said that the lake would be restocked at various times during the summer according to how fast the fish were taken out by anglers.

He added that according to reports the upper reaches of Fires creek in Clay county was particularly well stocked this year with a carry over from last year and that the real sportsman would find the fishing more to his liking there, he believed, than in the other areas.

The season's schedule is as follows:

Cliffside Lake—May 15-16, 22, 23, 29-30-31; June every day; July, every day; August, every day.

Fires Creek Area—May 1, 2, 8-9, 15-16, 22-23, 29-30-31; June 5-6, 12-13, 19-20; July 3-4-5, 17-18, 24-25; August 1, 7-8, 21, 22, 28-29.

1. Big and Little Santeetlah Creeks—May 1-2, 22-23, 29-30-31; June 12-13, 26-27; July 3-4-5, 10-11, 24-25; August 7-8, 21-22, 28-29.

2. Slick Rock, Deep, Bear and Barkers Creeks—May 8-9, 29-30-31; June 12-13, 26-27; July 3-4-5, 10-11, 24-25; August 7-8, 21-22, 28-29.

Wayah Bald Area—May 1-2, 8-9, 15-16, 22, 23, 29-30-31; June

12-13, 19-20; July 3-4-5, 17-18, 31; August 1, 21-22, 28-29.

Standing Indian Area—May 1-2, 8-9, 15-16, 22-23, 29-30-31; June 5-6, 12-13, 19-20; July 3-4-5, 17-18, 24-25, 31; August 1, 7-8, 21-22, 28-29.

Fishing shall be in complete accordance with State laws and according to the following regulations:

1. Daily permits will be required of all persons, the fee for which will be \$1.00. License requirements shall comply with State laws.

2. Treble or "gang" hooks are prohibited.
