## Architects Draw Working Plans For Clinic Section

At a meeting of the board of trustees of the Highlands Community hospital, held Saturday night, plans were made for the summer activities. Members of the board said that, although the site has been cleared and graded to some extent, it would not be practicable to start any building operations until the local labor situation eases, since the busy summer season affects all classes of labor, and practically all who have pledged their services for construction work are otherwise engaged.

In the meantime, the architects are preparing the working plans for the clinic section, which will be the first phase of construction, as announced some time ago.

Plans were also made at Saturday's meeting for renewing the financial campaign at an early date. In this connection, it is proposed to hold one or more carnivals during July and August, as well as other benefits.

The names of those assisting the various committee chairmen are expected to be ready for announcement shortly.
