North Carolina-all sections of it, from the highlands to the a-can produce good cord yields when recommended practices are followed, according to of framing lumber for sale, Dr. E. R. Collins, in charge of in different dimensions, extension agronomy at State college.

Records of the 100-Bushel Corn club for 1947 indicate that good corn production is not confined to any particular area, Dr. Collins said. Farmers in virtually every county in the state were able to qualify for mem-bership in the club last year b following approved practices, h asserted.

Such widely scattered counties as Currituck, Transylvania, Un-ion, Forsyth and Pitt were among the leaders in 100-Bush-el Corn club membership last year, Dr. Collins stated. He said Wake county led the state with 66 farmers who produced 100 or more bushels of corn per acre in 1947. Randolph placed second with 30, McDowell third with 29, and Buncombe and Nash tied for fourth position with 25 each.

The agronomist said interest in the 200-bushel corn contest for 1948 is increasing each week, as additional farmers enter the competition. A total of \$3,000 in prize money is being offered.

state College Hints To Farm Homemakers

Entomologists advise DDT protection after cleaning clothes closets. Apply a DDT spray to walls, woodwork, baseboards and shelves as a protection against clothes moths and carpet beetlefor the warm weather season. An oil spray is best for this purpose because it does not leave a white deposit as a water spray does. It should be a residual spray rather than one of the so-called aerosol bombs or space sprays if it is to be effective over the months in killing insects which come in contact with closet surfaces. Aerosol sprays kill flying insects or those which happen to be exposed at the time but they are without lasting effect because they leave little or no residue. DDT solutions also may be
