New Ruling Affects N. C. Veterans Who Are In Training

Effective July 1 veterans having full-time jobs again may be permitted to take a full week's schooling or 25 or more hours, provided the course is essentially vocational in nature, according to K. S. Hulme, district officer of the N. C. Veterans commission.

The veterans education committee, the state approving agency for all on-the-job training and educational institutions training former servicemen under the GI Bill, at its last meeting in Raleigh modified its previous ruling on this matter, Mr. Hulme said. Until this change, the VEC held to the rule that "a school will not be approved for more than 15 hours per week if it is planned for veterans who are regularly employed on a full-time basis."

Inquiries at a number of high schools and night schools for veterans in this district have disclosed that veterans holding regular jobs and with families to support have excellent records as to grades and attendance. This was particularly true in the vocational courses of carpentry, masonry, mechanics, house-wiring, etc., according to Mr. Hulme.
