Q. How should I prepare beets or canning?

A. Only baby beets should be canned. Before washing the beets, trim off the tops leaving one inch of stem and all of root. Wash them carefully to remove dirt and grit. Cover with boiling water and boil until skins slip easily. This usually requires 15 to 25 minutes, depending on the size of the beets. After the beets have build, skin and trim them. Baby beets can be canned whole; medium or large ones should be cut in inch slices, halved or quartered. Pack them hot into hot jars to 1/2 inch of the top, then cover with fresh, boiling water leaving 1/2 inch head space. Add 1 teaspoon salt to each quart jar, adjust lid and process for 25 minutes for pints and 55 minutes for quarts in a pressure canner at 10 pounds of

If you have a tough time breaking in a new pair of shoes, don't blame it all on the shoes. Are you sure you are wearing the right size? If you are wearing the same size you were five or six years ago, your shoes

Perhaps you would like to have these rules issued by a foot specialist when you buy your next pair of shoes: (1) Never tell the salesman your size and let it go at that. You're grown up now, it's true; but your feet may have grown a half-size since you bought your last shoes. That's only one-sixth of an inch, you know! (2) Have both your feet measured in a standing position. The two feet usually differ in size, and they're longer when you stand than when you're seated.
(3) Examine the materials of

the shoe carefully. Are the uppers made of soft leatner with a won't constrict your feet? Are the soles of genume reatme flexible enough to give your feet free play? If not, you may be stepping toward trouble.

(4) Make sure the shoes are roomy in the front part and snug at the heel. You should be able to wiggle your toes freely inside the shoes. If you can't, they're too short, and you'll have breaking-in troub. a-plenty.

Be sure clothes are entirely dry before packing them for summer travel, clothing specialists caution. If clothes are even slightly damp from pressing or from a humid atmosphere, they will wrinkle badly in a suitcase and may even mildew. Mildew can ruin clothes in a hurry given dampness, darkness, and warmth.


