Forestry Extension Work In N. C. Is Reorganized

The forestry extension program in North Carolina has been reorganized and a specialist has been assigned of the five extension districts in the state, according to W. Graeber, in charge of forestry extension at State college. John E. Ford, Asheville, is the Western district specialist. The staff also includes John L. Gray, assistant extension forester, at State college. Mr. Graeber said these men are now setting up their headquarters. They have been instructed to visit all the counties of their respective districts as rapidly as possible, to meet the farm agents and to discuss plans for an intensified program of forestry extension. This program, Mr. Graeber stated, will be built on an educational and demonstrational basis. The educational program will include such activities as timber thinning and stand improvement, selective harvesting, pruning, management plans on demonstration farms, timber scaling, forest planting for both timber and erosion control, marketing, 4-H club and other types of contests, tours, and field days.

Revised 'Farming Guide' Available To General Public

Copies of a recently revised popular bulletin of the State college, extension service entitled, "A Farming Guide for North Carolina," is now available for distribution. The publication contains much information dealing with the more important farming operations. This information, condensed and presented as "jobs to be done by months," provides a check list for the farmer to use in planning work which should be done on his farm each month. The calendar of work includes jobs to be done for livestock, field crops, fruits and vegetables, poultry, and general operation. Other information such as recommended varieties, seeding rates, and fertilizer requirements for crops is included. Copies may be obtained free by writing the Agricultural Editor, State College, Raleigh. Please ask for Extension Circular No. 263.

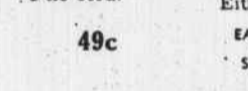
