PUBLIC URGED TO HELP KEEP FOREST CLEAN

Wasilik Cites Problem Few Irresponsibles Create

Abusive use of recreational areas by irresponsible individuals is making it difficult and expensive for the Nantahala National Forest work crews to keep the areas clean and inviting to family groups, Ranger John Wasilik, Jr., said this week.

He pointed out that watermelon rinds are often left scattered about the recreational areas. This is insanitary, as it draws flies, ants and other insects and make the areas unpleasant to folk who use it later. Ranger Wasilik added that garbage pits and pails are provided for the use of picnickers, and asked that all unburnable waste be placed in these receptacles.

Mr. Wasilik requested that persons using the area burn their papers—magazines, cartons, food wrappers and so on, in the fireplaces. "Many folk who use the area", he said, "have told me: 'I hate to see old newspapers, food wrappers, beer cans, bottles scattered around the forest . . . It just doesn't seem right to have those things littering up the woods.'"

Free wood is available in the central wood yard for those wishing to do cooking. However, Ranger Wasilik pointed out that it is in lengths that will have to be chopped by the user. He asked that people be considerate in their use of this wood and leave some for the other fellow.

A limited amount of money is available for recreational development on the Nantahala National Forest. "If we've got to spend all of it constantly repairing and cleaning up, then there's little we can do about expanding recreation, as much as we'd like to do it," Mr. Wasilik declared.

He emphasized that the use of all conveniences at the recreational areas are on the "honor system." "The U. S. Forest Service doesn't have the money with which to police the area frequently enough. We know that when a family comes to the forest to relax, they want to find a clean, sanitary, natural-looking place. They like to feel that they are 'away from it all.' We want them to feel that way. We want them to continue to keep coming and, with our limited means, we are doing everything possible to provide them with the atmosphere they seek. All that we ask is some consideration for the Golden Rule—to do unto others as you would have them do unto you. In other words—think a little about the other fellow."

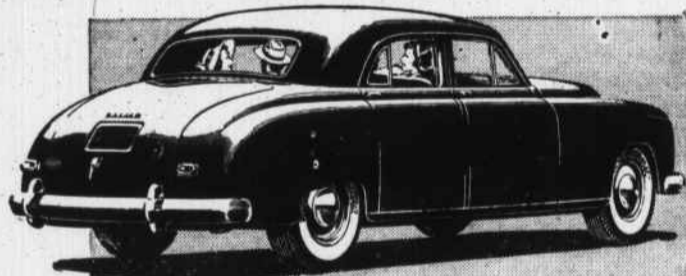

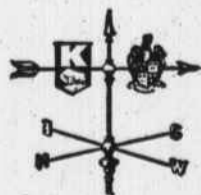
