Records of the National Saf-ety council show that farm residents have contributed more than their share to the postwar increase in motor vehicle accidents, County Agent S. W. Mendenhall said this week in urging farm residents to prac-tice highway safety.

More farm people are killed in motor vehicle mishaps than in any other type of accident, the county agent asserted. Last year there were 7,000 fatalities 250,000 lost-time injuries, he added.

Q. What special points should be considered in planning a new kitchen?

A. The kitchen should be worked out to scale and plans made for necessary activities. centers for preparing food, cooking, and cleaning up after meals should be within a space of tour to six feet. Do not separate work centers by doorways. Arrange for a place to serve family meals in the kitchen. Have a sink with hot and cold running water and a drain. Have a good stove with handy shelves for cooking utensils. Provide plenty of cabinet space with toe space underneath. Cover cabinet table tops with material which is easy to clean. Arrange equipment so you will move logically from one job to another. Install electric outlets at proper places.

Q. How can I prevent small scatter rugs from slipping?

A. Fasten an old jar rubber underneath each corner.

Q. What is the most desirable source of seed?

A. Seed that is grown locally or known to be adapted to your area and is free of noxious weeds is the most desirable.

Q. Are red clover and alsike clover of value in hay mixtures.
