Miss Flanagan
Will Be Chief Counselor At Winthrop

Miss Ann Flanagan, of Franklin, who this year will be a senior at Winthrop college, Rock Hill, S. C., has been chosen as chief freshman counselor at the college, and she and Miss Jean Campbell, of Walterboro, another senior, who is president of the college Y. W. C. A., will direct the annual fall retreat at Winthrop, according to an announcement received here from Rock Hill.

Miss Flanagan, Miss Campbell, and 18 counselors will arrive on the Winthrop college campus September 4 for the retreat, a training program to plan for the arrival of the new students September 6.

The counselors will welcome the new students to the school, assist them during freshman orientation week, acquaint them with the campus, faculty, and college customs, and each counselor will have a group of about 10 freshmen to advise throughout the year.

Here's Fishermen's Club That Bars Lying; Substitutes Official Weights

WILMINGTON.—Thirty-three years ago sport fishermen of this coastal town decided that, while fishing and lying about fishing made a good sport, the truth was even more fun. So they organized the New Hanover Fishing Club, which today, with over 1,200 members, is the largest such organization in the world.

The club has stimulated sport fishing greatly in Southeastern North Carolina, but it has cut down on the lying to a calamitous extent, because the club's many official weighing stations, which are strung all up and down the coast, put the catches on record, and the ones that get away are not even recognized for purposes of small and polite talk.

Almost every "serious" fisherman in town is a member—not to mention a lot of fishermen—with the roster includ-

ing public officials, stevedores, clerks, and sub-debs, and the organization can throw a lot of weight around here. While organized primarily to promote good fellowship, to encourage skillful fishing, and to support legislation protecting game fish, the club's most conspicuous activity is centered in its annual tournament. Scores of prizes, ranging from cash to unlikely merchandise, are offered. In the past, the prizes have ranged from a half-ton of coal to 10 free shaves. Merchants are enthusiastic supporters of the contest and the club.

Most important, however, has been the record-keeping work of the secretary over the years. Wilmingtonians are pretty satisfied that they know the largest channel bass ever taken here was a 53-pounder, the largest blue a 10 1/4-pounder, and the biggest striped bass a fellow

hefting 35 pounds, 2 ounces. Territory of the club covers more than 100 miles of sea-coast and many inland waters; membership now includes many visiting firemen who visit this area for sport.

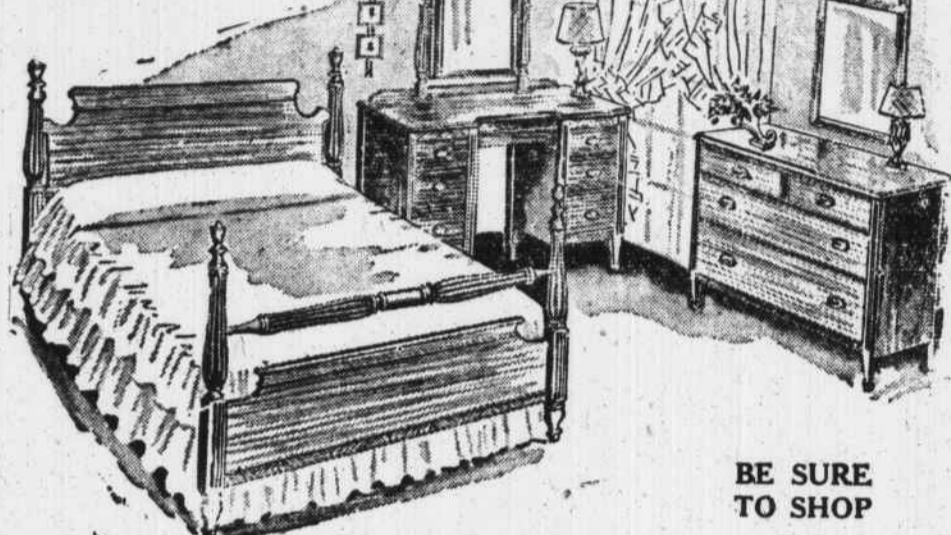
The annual meeting is so well attended that it is held in the county courthouse or city hall, and usually some of the charter members show up, including veteran Burke H. Bridgers, club historian, whose enthusiasm epitomizes the group's spirit. Bridgers, instead of sticking to old fashioned methods, employs balloons and kites to take his bait into shoaly waters unattainable by boat. But whether from boats, in the surf, off piers, with or without kites, Wilmington undoubtedly is the fishingest town in this section, and the people say they are, year-around, the fishingest people in the world.

Two Mecklenburg County dairymen, Jap and Frank Catherly, have found that they can make concrete fence posts for their pastures at a cost of less than \$1 per post. They use a mixture of one part cement, two parts sand, and four parts gravel, and reinforce the posts with scrap steel.
