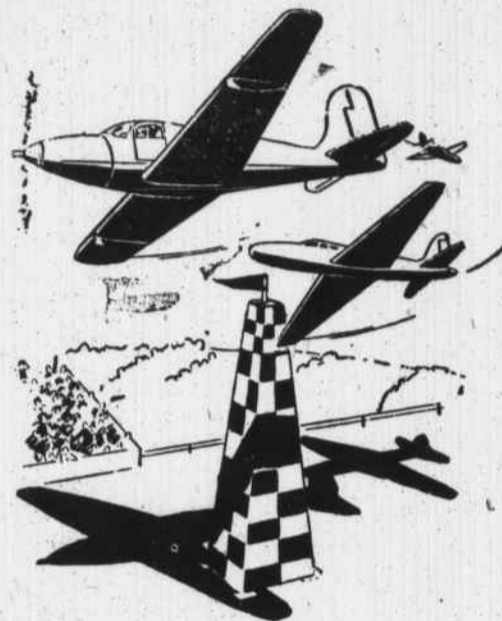

Sealed bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, Franklin, North Carolina, up to and not later than 2:00 p. m. October 4, 1948, and opened immediately thereafter for all live timber marked or designated for cutting, located on an area embracing about 1100 acres within the Ray Branch of Burnington Creek Unit, Little Tennessee River, watershed, Macon County, Nantahala National Forest, North Carolina, estimated to be 509 M feet B. M. more or less of hardwoods and softwoods. No bid of less than \$26.00 per M for northern red oak and sugar maple; \$22.00 per M for white oak; \$18.00 per M for birch and red maple; \$15.00 per M for basswood; \$7.00 per M for chestnut oak; \$5.00 per M for black oak, scarlet oak and buckeye; \$4.00 per M for chestnut and \$3.00 per M for hemlock will be considered. In addition to prices bid for stumpage, a deposit of \$1.00 per M feet for all timber cut will be required for sale area betterment. \$1500 must be deposited with each bid, to be applied on the purchase price, refunded or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to conditions of sale. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Before bids are submitted, full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale and the submission of bids should be obtained from the Forest Supervisor, Franklin, North Carolina.
