Santeetlah Bear And Boar Hunt Dates Are Announced

Raleigh-Dates and special World War II Veterans regulations for combined bear and wild boar hunts on the Nantahala National Forest havbeen established under cooperative agreement between the C. Wildlife Resources Com-N. mission and the U.S. Forest service, according to a joint announcement made by Executive Director Clyde P. Patton of the Wildlife Resources Commission and E. W. Renshaw, Supervisor of the Nantahala National Forest.

The Santeetlah Wildlife Management Area, which lies in the Nantarala National Forest, will be divided into two units, and organized hunts will be conducted in these units on aiternate two-day periods beginning October 18 and ending December 3. A total of 14 hunts will be organized, with seven two-day hunts in each of the area units. Hunting parties may not exceed 25 members, and each member will be allowed a limit of one boar and one bear during the two-day period.

Persons interested in participating in the Santeetlah hunts may write directly to the N. C. Wildlife Resources Commission. Raleigh, North Carolina for full particulars and application forms. Applications will be accepted and drawing made by parties only.

"Successful" applicans for the hunts will be determined at a public drawing to be hold in the Chamber of Commerce, Asheville, on October 12. Drawings will be made by parties only, and names appearing on more than one party list will be disqualified.


