which held lighted yellow candles in silver holders. This annual reception for the school faculty started several years ago by the Misses Ravenel as an expression of their interest in the school.



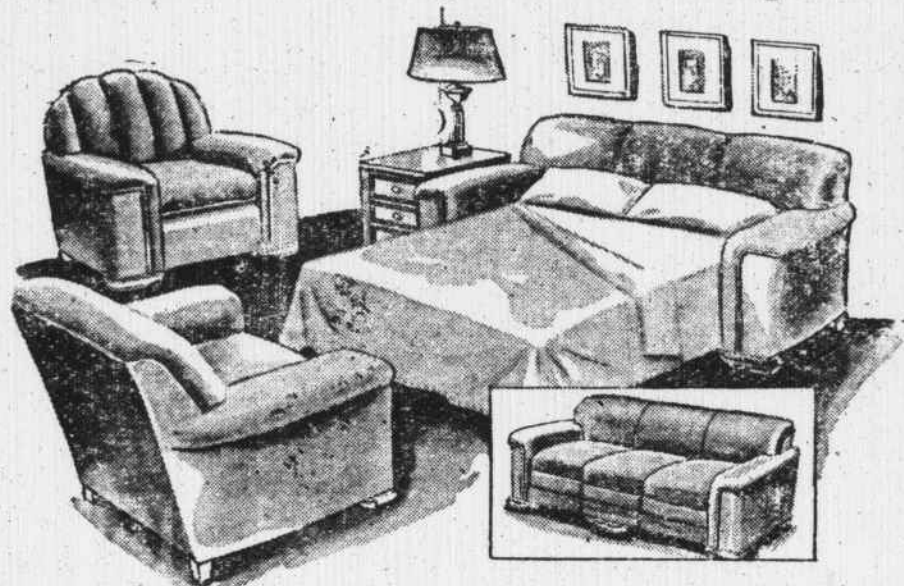
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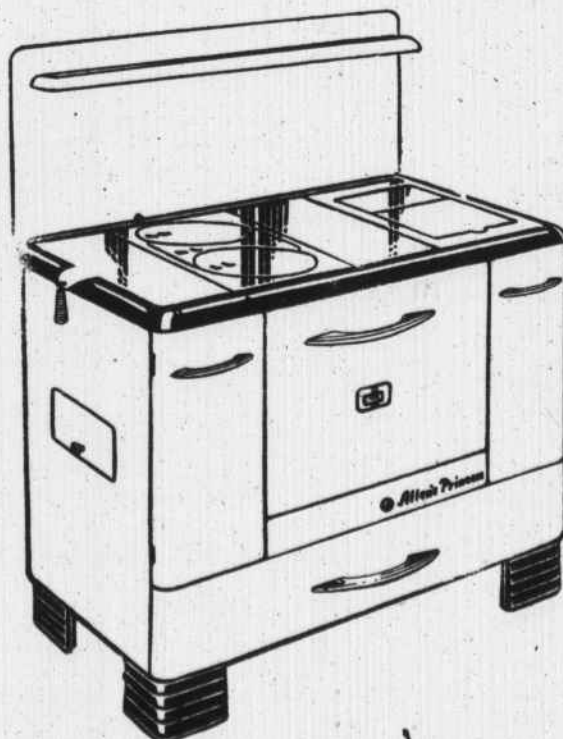
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
